What it is used for

Vallum is indicated for the management of <u>anxiety disorders</u> or for the short term relief of the symptoms of anxiety. Anxiety or tension associated with the stress of everyday life usually does not require treatment with an anxiolytic. In acute <u>alcohol withdrawal</u>, VALIUM may be useful in the symptomatic relief of acute agitation, tremor, impending or acute delirium tremens and hallucinosis. VALIUM is a useful adjunct for the relief of reflex muscle spasm due to local trauma (injury, inflammation) to muscles, bones and joints. It can also be used to combat spasticity due to upper motor neuron lesions such as <u>cerebral palsy</u> and paraplegia, as well as in athetosis and stiff-man syndrome. Intravenous VALIUM is useful in controlling status epilepticus and the spasms of tetanus

How to take it

The way to take this medicine is: Oral. This medicine is taken by mouth.

- Store below 30 degrees Celsius
- Shelf lifetime is 5 Years.

You should seek medical advice in relation to medicines and use only as directed by a healthcare professional.

Always read the label. If symptoms persist see your healthcare professional.






Inside the Data Layer – Healthdirect Knowledge Graph
